1. *Salix* Linnaeus

Salix babylonica L., Sp. Pl. (1753) 1017; --Jacobs, Fl. Males. ser. 1, 5 (1954) 109, Fig. 1i
Possibly wild in Iran, China, Japan and widely cultivated in S and C Europe, SW and S Asia, the Himalayas. In Malesia: only cultivated in Peninsular Malaysia, Java and the Philippines: LUZON. Known from one sterile specimen.

Salix tetrasperma Roxb., Pl. Corom. 1 (1795) 66, t. 97; --Merr., EPFP 2 (1923) 22; --Jacobs, Fl. Males. ser. 1, 5 (1954)
Afghanistan and the Punjab (cultivated) eastwards through Myanmar, Thailand, Indochina, to S China (cult.?, Yunnan, Guangxi, Guangdong) and Taiwan, N & C Sumatra. Simalur Is, Peninsular Malaysia (introduced), N part of C & E Java, Lesser Sunda Is (Lombok; Sumbawa; Sumba; Flores), E Borneo, Philippines. LUZON: Cagayan, Laguna, Bulacan, Rizal, BOHOL, MINDANAO. In forests in swamps and near streams at low and medium altitudes.
