

Family 238. PLUMBAGINACEAE

1. *Plumbago* Linnaeus

1. *Plumbago indica* L. in Stickm., Herb. Amb. (1754) 24; --Merr., Fl. Manila (1912) 362; EPFP 3

Plumbago rosea L., Sp. Pl. ed. 2 (1762) 215; --Merr., Fl. Manila (1912) 362.

Widely distributed in the Old World tropics. Probably native in SE Asia. Malesia except Peninsular Malaysia, Borneo and New Guinea.

2. *Plumbago zeylanica* L., Sp. Pl. (1753) 151; -Merr., Fl. Manila (1912) 362; EPFP 3 (1923) 275;

--Steen., Fl. Males. ser. 1, 4 (1949) 109.

Old World tropics to Hawaii, possibly indigenous only to SE Asia. Throughout Malesia (except Borneo and the Moluccas).

Cultivated, non naturalized taxa:

Native of the Mediterranean.

275; --Steen., Fl. Males. ser. 1, 4 (1949) 111.

Native of S Africa. A common ornamental in Malesia, up to 1100m. Not naturalized.
